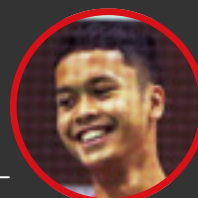
CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR CHAMPIONS!

"BAT and all the support staff have been great. I stay in my room and only leave for training or playing. I always find fun things to do like playing games or watching action films. I feel safe here."



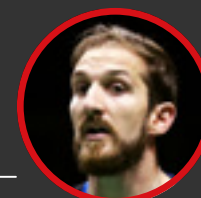
